Introduction

We live in a world of abundance best symbolized in a feast set on a banquet table.

We also live in an unequal world where that abundance is experienced differently. For some, a feast may be a simple meal of rice with vegetables, or cassava and sardines. Tables around the world vary greatly. However, giving thanks for food is universal.

What does it mean to give thanks for food, knowing many people do not get enough to eat each day? When Christ taught us to pray "Give us this day, our daily bread" the 'us' is not limited to our immediate circles. It is the 'us' as in the human family—our neighbours both here and around the world. This prayer is an expression of our trust in God, the creator and provider, to whom we give thanks.








Make Us Worthy. Lord







Amen.


